Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board (the 'Board') are the charity Trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by the Presbytery. The Board is appointed from within the congregation. Members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals, who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the church, to become members of the Board. Board members are then appointed at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years, after which they must seek re-election at the next Stated Annual Meeting.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church and meets six times a year. The Congregational Board, which also meets six times a year, is chaired by a chairperson. Certain responsibilities are delegated to elected committees, as appropriate. The church is part of the national Church of Scotland.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition, and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. In a normal year, services of Worship are held weekly, with special services being held for a variety of purposes, as deemed necessary or desirable. Less formal café church services are held monthly. Provision is made for Youth activities and for Family activities to take place. The Congregation are concerned about environmental issues and work on good practice within our buildings and community. The church is registered with Eco-Congregation Scotland.

Achievements and Performance

Our Minister, the Rev Mark RS Smith, has guided the Kirk Session and Congregational Board in maintaining the the life of the congregation and in managing the Church's activities.

The Minister has adopted various means to maintain the advancement of the Faith and support of the church family during the year. This has included involvement in the wider community's events and projects. Our meeting rooms are regularly used by local groups and organisations for their own events.

The Board's policy has been to restrict Fabric costs to the general and essential upkeep of the Church buildings. Some repairs and maintenance have been done to our buildings. Seating in St Ninian's Church has been reconfigured to permit different types of use, with more individual seats. The Church has paid a share of Fabric repairs and upgrading of the Manse. The refurbishment of the Kitchen area in St Ninian's Church was completed during the year. The Kitchen is now fully in use and an additional toilet will be completed in 2024.

Financial Review

Considering only the Unrestricted Funds as set out on page 7 of this document, Receipts exceeded Payments by £333. The budgeted excess for the year had been £6,154. No funds were drawn down from the Revenue Fund. Some payments due were not claimed (c. £2000) and will be paid in 2024. The Receipts from offerings and gift aided donations of £18,294 at page 10, were generally as anticipated. Fundraising activities raised £633. Recovery of tax on Gift Aid contributions amounted to £4,259. These figures combined, the Receipts totalled £26,443 for the year, similar to the year before.

As set out on page 10, expenditure on Fabric maintenance and repairs was £2,150, against a budget of £9,000. Heating & Lighting costs of £2,850 compared with £4,000 in budget.

The Restricted Fund for the refurbishment of the St Ninian's building showed £18,456 expenditure, principally for the Kitchen works. A drawdown was made from Church moneys held by the General Trustees amounting to £16,000. Further expenditure will be incurred on the project in 2024.

At page 12, as an Appendix to the Congregational Accounts, details are reported on the Consolidated Fabric Funds held by the General Trustees. The General Trustees rearranged the presentation and allocation of these holdings during 2023. In summary, the Funds held increased by £13,504 for the year, subject to the £16,000 drawdown noted above, leaving a reduction of £2,496 in Funds held at year end.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of at least three month's expenditure, including designated funds. At the end of the year the Church held Unrestricted cash funds of £14,454 of which £5,845 was for designated funds. The Trustees have needed to spend resources on essential fabric repairs and maintenance, and to comply with legislation. Applications can be made to The Church of Scotland General Trustees to draw down funds held in the Consolidated Fabric Fund for this and certain other purposes.

The Church also held £6,648 of Restricted funds. These are provided for the purposes specified in Note 3 on page 9 of this document.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session and Congregational Board must prepare financial statements that give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report

For the Year Ended 31 December 2023

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Glencairn & Moniaive Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023, which are set out on pages 7 to 12 below.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section (44)(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.



For the year under review, the minimum stipend was £30,135 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) was £37,032.
